Pastor's Ramblings ...

Hey, are you thinking of joining the Roman Catholic Church or learning more about your faith, things that you may have forgotten? The Catholic RCIA process which started as a result of the renewal of the Roman Catholic Church after Vatican Council II is presented in stages that provide an excellent model of basic faith development/rediscovery.

We will be starting the 2016-17 class Thursday, September 8 @ 7 pm, and I personally invite you to register and begin a beautiful discovery of Catholicism. The program is a wonderful way to rediscover your faith too. Many people have discovered by taking RCIA, even though they are long time Catholics, they gain increased knowledge and a deeper understanding of their faith.

Many adults interested in learning/becoming Catholic, or those just thinking about it, follow a process known as the **RCIA** — the Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults.

The RCIA process has several distinct "stages". These stages are a **good model** of faith.

- **Inquiry:** the initial period of asking questions and checking it out, but aren't yet ready to commit.
- **Catechumenate:** In this stage, you're developing your faith and are being "catechized" — learning catechism or the basic points about Catholic faith and life.
- **Purification and preparation:** The Church will help you focus and intensify your faith as you commit your life to Christ and be received into the Church at Easter. If you're following the RCIA process, you'll go through a beautiful series of Gospel-based meditations during Lent, which is the time frame of this period.
- **Initiation** itself, the culmination of the whole process! You're received into the Church during the Easter Vigil Mass, where you'll receive the sacraments of initiation: baptism, confirmation, and Eucharist. (If you've already been baptized, you won't be baptized again.)
- **Mystagogy:** This period lets you reflect and learn more about the mysteries of the Mass and the Sacraments that you now participate in fully.

STEWARDSHIP AT ST. CECILIA

Stewardship is about recognizing and receiving God’s gifts and sharing them proportionately and sacrificially. It’s about following Jesus Christ. It’s about conversion. “Stewardship is the grateful response of a Christian disciple who recognizes and receives God’s gifts and shares these gifts in love of God and neighbor.”

The Four Pillars of Stewardship put flesh to the spirit of giving and provide a great opportunity to set examples of stewardship opportunities in the parish.

The Choir: Ministers of Sung Worship

Congregational singing was introduced into Sunday liturgies in the 1960s and many Catholics, musicians, and clergy thought there would no longer be a need for choirs. However, choirs are more needed than ever. They make it a priority to lead and support the singing of the whole assembly. The primary ministry role of the choir is to sing various parts of the Mass, whether in dialogue or in alteration with the rest of the assembly. The Kyrie, Agnus Dei, and Gospel Acclamation have a call and response form, which work well with the ministry role of the choir.

The three major processional chants of the Mass—The Entrance, Offertory, and Communion hymns may be sung by the congregation and choir or the choir alone.

Whether singing in alteration, alone, or with the rest of the congregation, the role of the choir is understood as aiding in the full conscious, and active participation of the faithful assembly. When the choir isn’t singing special repertoire, they support the congregation and add beauty and variety to the singing with harmonies and descants.
